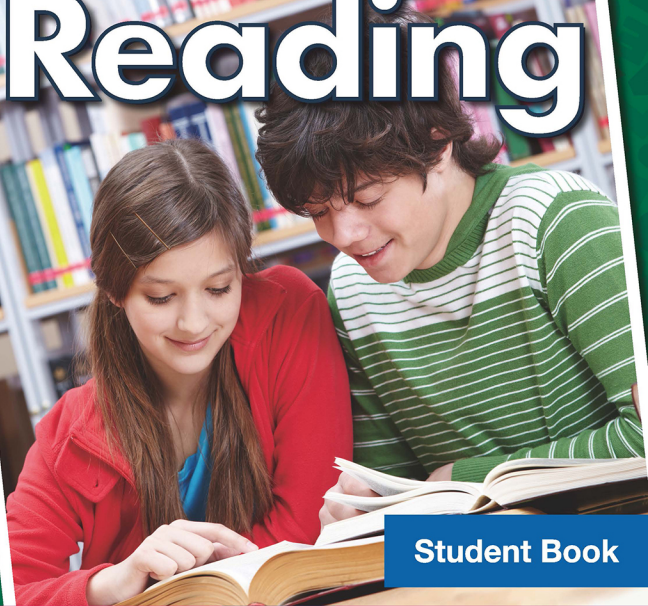

The Founder of amazon.com

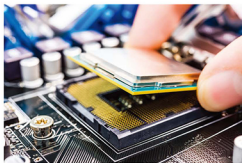


▲ Jeff Bezos



1 Millions of people shop on Amazon.com. It is the largest online store in the U.S.A. The founder and leader of the company is Jeff Bezos.

2 Bezos's love for computers started at a young age. He enjoyed doing science projects during his childhood. Bezos **pursued** this interest as he grew up. In college, he studied **engineering** and computer science.

3 After **graduation**, Bezos developed computer **software** at several companies. At the last one, he became the **vice president**. He was the youngest person to hold that position.

4 In 1994, Bezos **quit** his job to start his own company. He wanted to be part of the growing online business. People thought he was making a mistake, but he was **confident**. Bezos made a business plan and **hired** people to start the company. Together, they set up Amazon.com in his garage.

- 5 Amazon.com was **launched** in 1995. It started as an online bookstore, selling books in the U.S.A. and other countries. Then, Bezos and his **employees** came up with more **innovative** ideas. They started selling different items, like CDs, clothes, and toys. Amazon.com quickly became very successful.
- 6 After 20 years, Amazon.com still continues to be a leader in online business. With Bezos **in charge**, Amazon.com has changed the way people shop.

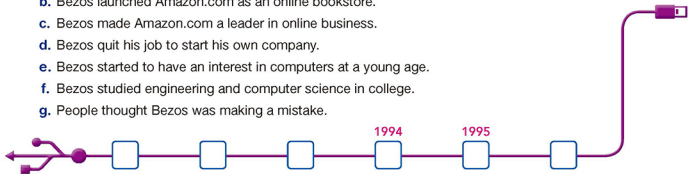

- 1 Jeff Bezos had an innovative idea for his company, Amazon.com. In 2007, he introduced the Amazon Kindle. It is a reading **device**. It allows users

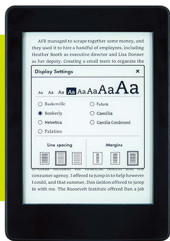
to **download** and read e-books. The Kindle has changed the way people read.

- 2 Users can carry a collection of e-books anywhere on the Kindle. They can download thousands of e-books and read them wherever they go. The Kindle is even lighter than a paper book. It is easier to carry around. It is like a **portable** library.

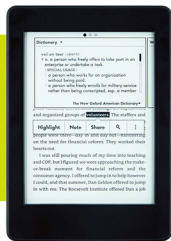
- 3 The Kindle makes reading more **reader-friendly**. Users can change the **font** style, font size, and **spacing** in e-books. This is especially helpful for people who have trouble reading. They can read better with bigger letters and wider spacing.
